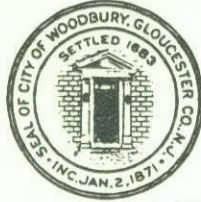

Bud, your support of the project and dedication of a piece of your land for its construction made this monument possible. Without that none of this would have happened.


